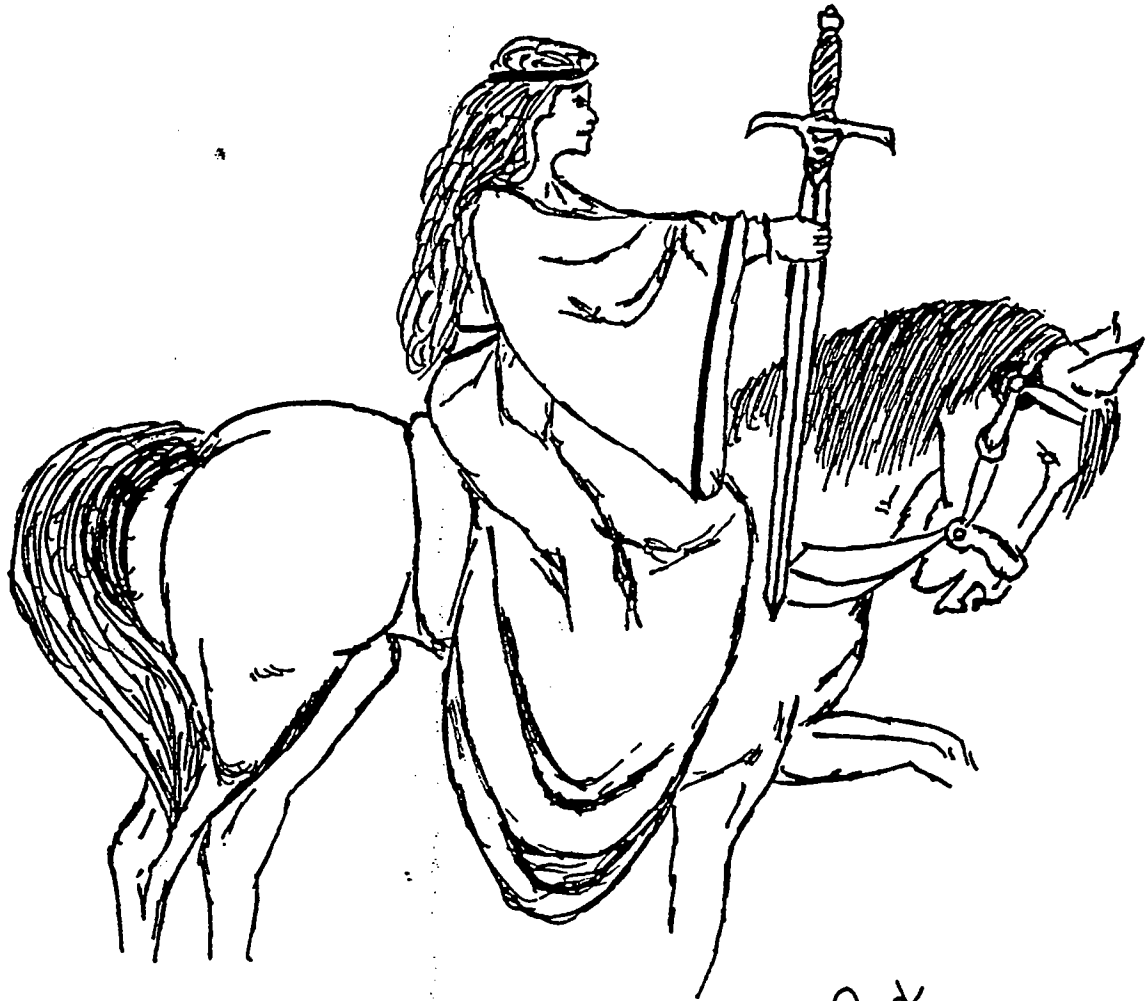

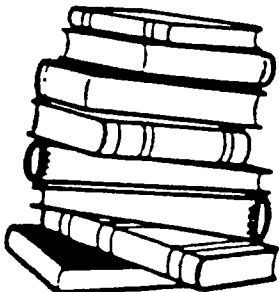

TJ ARTISTS RATE HIGH

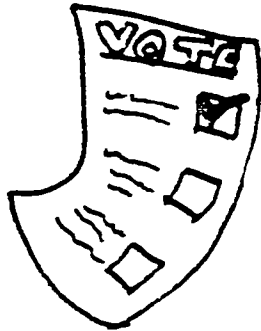
For the third year in a row, THS received the Best Cool Exhibit award at the DoDDS Mediterranean Art Festival, a year held in Adana, Turkey.

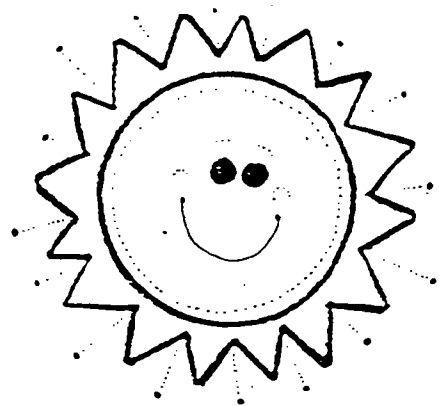

OUTSTANDING MODEL TO BE SELECTED

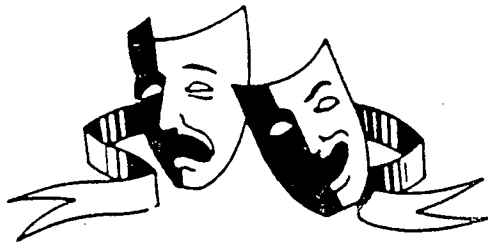
Modeling students are busily preparing for the 1989 Model of the Year Show, to take place June 2nd in the NCO Club.

Brian Carothers won the men's singles championship after SIXTEEN match points against his Zaragoza nemesis, Angel Andrews.

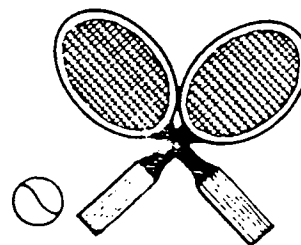
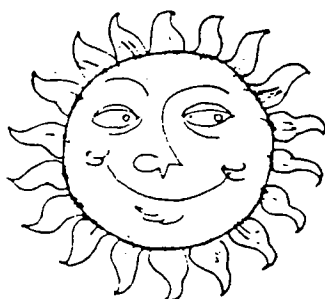
The team of Robert Adams-David Exner defeated teammates Chris Kuranko and Patrick Boyd in three sets to capture the men's doubles finals.

Well, it happened again. TJ's track team went through another successful season. After winning both meets at Rota and Zaragoza, we ultimately proved ourselves by winning Regionals.

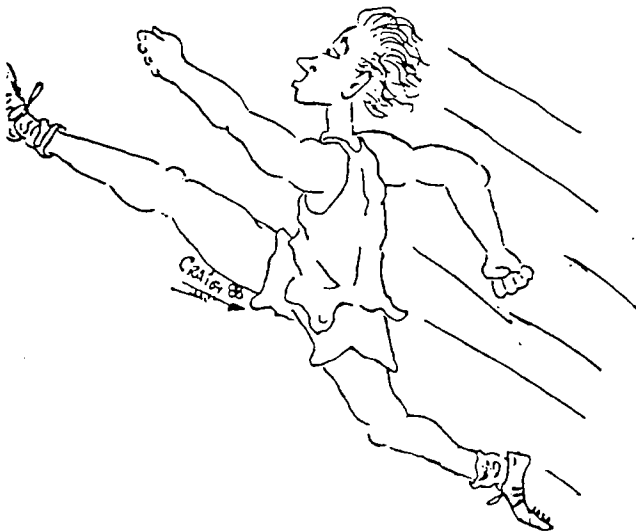

Regionals occurred on May 5 and 6 here in Torrejon. We saved the heat and did our best, which was certainly good. 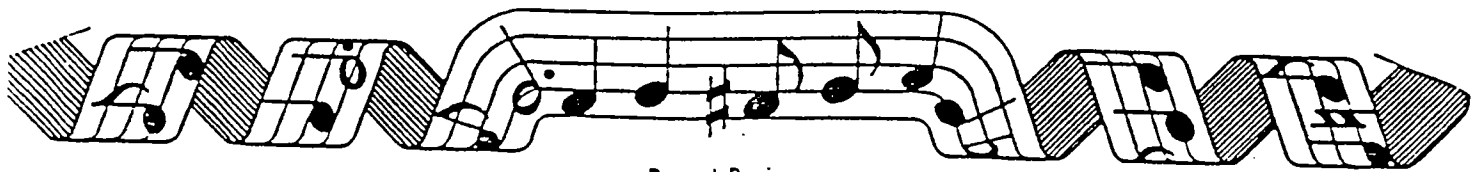

Record Reviews

Straight outta Compton by N.W.A

Six words and five letters will explain why the East Coast no longer rules hip-hop. King T, Tone Loc, Easy E, Too Short, and N.W.A. *Straight outta Compton*, which after six weeks of "releasal" had sold over 500,000 copies (about 14,000 per day), is helping the Sunny Side slowly (but surely) catch up to those Easterners. The co-hosting of Easy E (he's only fifteen?!) makes a good album even better, and shows that no one is too good for anyone in the rap community.

"...tha Police" is the most unusual court case I've ever seen. The perfect baseline and drumbeat are shown for such an "experiment". "Dopeman" is about the guy on the block sellin' his stuff. "Compton's n the House" basically concerns...FUN! The dominant drum gives it away. The title track is an extremely powerful normality. A theme song of sorts, all furious lyrics and beats are literally heaved into your stirrup. "I ain't the 1" expresses their ideas on feminism (chuckle) ...it = pure funk and an overhead atmosphere of "unsericusness". "Gangsta Gangsta" concerns a gangster life to a stop-go-go-stop-go-stop-go-pause beat containing an overly repeated verse. "If it ain't Ruff" well, ain't ruff! Surprisingly enough, a semi-mellow beat is expressed in this gem. "8 ball" refers to their fav sport when they're (don't be) ridiculous. 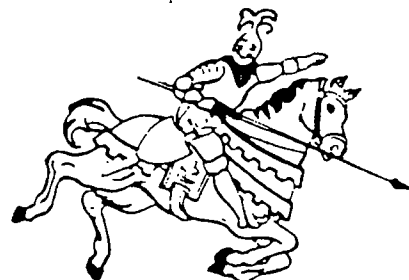
